Regarding clinical ethics, the theory and methodology of moral case deliberation form a central (yet not the only) instrument for such improvements. We also strive to improve the quality of clinical ethics professionals in the clinic by fostering a dialogue between theory and practice, ethics and clinical practice, clinical ethics and empirical research.

4. An expert in the field of : 'Moralmap.com: **WEBSITE FOR MORAL REFLECTION**' (An interactive, image-based tool for opening moral issues up for discussion); from the University of Amsterdam (Myra van Zwieten)

Moralmap.com is a new educational tool that invites students and trainee physicians to reflect on moral questions like: 'When do you label someone as abnormal?', 'How assertive should your patients be?', 'Do you believe in fate or human agency?', 'Is a driven doctor a good doctor by definition?' or 'Which link in the chain are you in the health care market?' Visually appealing assignments encourage users to reflect on these kind of moral issues in a playful way. Personal views are made explicit step by step, based on individual case histories. Print-outs of the assignments form the basis for further classroom discussions. Moralmap can serve as a virtual toolbox that doctors can use throughout their career. The website can be seen as a form of blended learning: an e-learning instrument which is embedded in education. Users carry out the assignments in their own environment and when it suits them. The website can be used for peer-based education in small groups. Moralmap is also suitable for individual training or remedial assignments, for instance in the framework of Medical Professionalism.
